Vijayanagar Minit Organisation Under Bukka I (1344-56-77)

Abstract

The kingdom of vijayanagar was established by the five sons of sangama. There are various views concerning how the family came to establish themselves at Hampi. The most likely view is that they were formerly in service with the Kakatiyas and then with Kampiladeva of kampili, before being appointed by the Hoysalas (Following the Hoysala Conguest of kampili) to administer Kampili, a location from which they moved their seat to Hampi in (Mitchiner 1998). This study prescribed the Kingdom of vijayanagar never had a universal currency system. There were always regional differences. These regional differences were especially pronounced during the early period, when the realm was being established by Harihara II (1377-1404) and Further mint reorganisation took place during the reigns of the two Devarayas.
